You will note school staff wearing masks more at these and other key times.


We have paused volunteers coming into school to work in classrooms for the time being.

Relationships and Health Education

Please look out for information relating to our revised RHE policy and programme which we will be consulting upon over the next few weeks. It is a statutory requirement that all primary schools now teach this key subject from January 2021.

Whilst we have always taught this subject within the context of the teachings of the Catholic Church, which will continue, the launch of the new programme from Ten Ten gives us the opportunity to share with you what we will cover and to seek the views of parents about the programme.
